Changing our structures in the parish:

advance notice for the Annual Meetings

For some years we have functioned with three different decision-making bodies: the St. John's Church Council, the St. Andrew's Church Council, and the PCC (which has consisted of the combined membership of both the Church Councils). At the AGMs this year, those present will be asked to approve changes to this and other organisational matters, in an attempt to bring us into line with the Church of England's rules.

It is proposed that we should function with two different bodies: a PCC functioning mainly at St. John's, and a Church Council for St. Andrew's. In addition, the rules do not make provision for elected deputy churchwardens, but do encourage the forming of a standing committee for the PCC. Why bother? To maximize the usefulness of our meetings. To bring us into line with what the C of E expects. And to give us confidence that we are taking important decisions in a proper manner.
